That is why, when Jesus called his disciples "salt" and "light," he declared their great importance. A Prayer to Avoid Entitlement

The Jewish people have a beautiful prayer form, a kind of litany to which the response is always "Dayenu!" (It would have been enough!).

They list, one by one, the mirabilia Dei, the wonderful works of God for their people and themselves, and after each one, shout out DAYENU! As if to say, "How much is it going to take for us to know that God is with us?!" It builds satisfaction instead of feeding dissatisfaction.

If we begin our day with any notion of scarcity, not-enoughness, victimhood, or "I deserve," I promise you the day will not be good--for you or for those around you. Nor will God be glorified. Maybe we all should begin our days with a litany of satisfaction, abundance, and enoughness. God, you have given me another day of totally gratuitous life: my health, my eyes, my ears, my mind, my taste, my family, my freedom, my education, clean water, more than enough food, a roof over my head, a warm bed and blanket, friends, sunshine, a beating heart, and your eternal love and guidance. To any one of these we must say, "And this is more than enough!"


Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy

"[Christ] is present in the sacrifice of the Mass... in the person of his minister" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 7) The Second Vatican Council reaffirmed that Christ is present both in the

Eucharist and in the other six sacraments. Each sacrament affirms a different aspect of Christ's powerful presence. In Eucharist, disciples are brought into deep communion with Christ and one anoth-er. When that unity is fractured, Penance is the sacrament of healing that restores communion with Christ and the Church. When

sickness and poor health challenge us physically, mentally, and spiritually, Anointing of the Sick is the balm that soothes and heals bodies, minds, and spirits. In Marriage, Christ makes possible the deep bond between the married couple. The couple becomes the do-mestic church. Through Holy Orders, the priest bears the presence of Christ in order to preside over the sacraments and to build up the Church. Each sacrament thus express-es an aspect of Christ's unfathomable presence and desire for us.

Worship 101

"What is the difference between a Bible and a Lectionary?"

"A Lectionary is composed of the readings and the responsorial psalm assigned for each Mass of the year (Sundays, weekdays, and special occasions). The readings are divided by the day or the theme (baptism, marriage, vocations, etc.) rather than according to the books of the Bible. Introductions and conclusions have been added to each reading. Not all of the Bible is included in the Lectionary.

Individual readings in the Lectionary are called periscopes, from a Greek word meaning a "section" or "cutting." Because the Mass readings are only portions of a book or chapter, introductory phrases, called incipits, are often added to begin the Lectionary reading, for example, "In those days," "Jesus said to his disciples," etc.
