Parish Administrator Report February 2021

Facilities and Grounds

- Continued to analyze HVAC large systems for Church and School
 - Continue to tweak controls
 - Planning and budgeting for necessary future upgrades
- Master Plan for the future of St Mary Campus
 - Buildings and Grounds Committee has been assessing needs for an updated Master Plan.
 - School needs more space for a dedicated Science Lab growing CougarCare, classroom for Spanish, etc.
 - Rectory/Parish Office needs about \$2 million to update to our current needs and for decades to come
 - Seton Center will need substantial work to meet our needs and bring into code.
 - new School Building Advisory Group
 - Comprised of staff, parents, teachers and facility professionals
 - Purpose: to guide projects to restore St Mary facilities and move forward to meet needs
 - $\circ \quad \mbox{for budgeting each year and years ahead}$
 - Currently over \$1.1 million of prioritized projects and growing
 - o Summer projects start chipping away at continued improvements
 - Advancement Committee has been reevaluating how we ask for time, talent and treasure.
 - Some of this planning intersects with B&G as well as School Facility Advisory

Business Office and Staff Development

- WinterFest Major Award Made \$18k including sponsors; plus Lisa Habel donated back the \$10k award = \$28k profit
- Budget preparation in progress. Many changes necessary to meet the lower donations and increased demands due to COVID-19.
- Hired Pastoral Admin, Mary Landrum, 15-20 hours per week
 - Admin to coordinate events, groups and missions for Religious Education and Pastoral programs
 - Frees others to address a broader amount of services

NOTE: Wages in 2015 (prior to joining St Mary) for Pastoral, Business, Religious Education and Outreach were higher than current. We are able to provide more services to parishioners with more PT staff.

- Maintenance Planning Began weekly coordination among Bill, Joe and Jeff. Prioritize tasks and duties
- Planning to rejuvenate Youth Ministry prior Youth Minister resigned
 - combining with Young Adult liaison
 - looking at new, different options

Network and Data Management

Completed working through effects of the Ransomware hack on St Mary's Network.

- Third Party specialist verified that no sensitive data was breached
- They confirmed security holes in old network that were used to hack our network. Those holes have been "plugged" with appropriate security now implemented.

Developing plans for future.

- Continue layering Best Practices into St Mary environment
- Logging all issues; managing priorities while working through a continual support work list
- Riverside (contractor) is handling a large percentage of the issues remotely
- Planning toward moving whole school to 1 to 1 computers
 - Prepares junior high for high school use of computers
 - o Evaluating cost

Re-bid St Mary internet contract

- Was under a 5 year contract; first opportunity to revisit
- Will save \$2,000 per year with more flexibility for bandwidth and security options built in
- Contract starts July 1, 2021

Industry Collaboration for the benefit of St Mary and the Archdiocese

- Continuing to work with Archdiocese to build Centralized Database for all parishes
- Revising Human Resources in Archdiocese
 - In contracting stage with new vendor to replace multiple, incompatible vendors
 - Many inefficient processes that waste time will be corrected
- Started discussions with Archdiocese about a common network and technology platform for all parishes and schools.

School Operations

- Tweaking implementation of new School Information System, FACTS SIS . Many advantages, but hurdles to implementation.
- Continue to work through COVID-19 issues to keep SMS open
- Hired "new" Principal (remove Interim tag)
- Assisting Principal in processing re-contracting faculty for next school year
 - o Retirements and moves among faculty and staff

SMAC Update: Parish Council Meeting 2/2021

- 1. Winter sports seasons of girls and boys basketball have come to an end.
 - a. Girls had 9 teams
 - b. Boys had 12 teams
 - c. Total # if players: Girls -81 / Boys- 102
 - d. Gym space continues to be an issue with the number of teams fielded each season
 - i. UCP is an additional cost each season to be able to accommodate practices/games for all teams.
 - ii. Middle School Teams are unable to play in the SMS gym due to the small size of the court. With CPS not allowing any outside rentals of their facilities this year, we needed secure additional rental hours and cleaning costs to UCP.
- 2. Spring Sports seasons will resume in late March/early April.
 - a. Soccer will start late March
 - i. Girls: 8 teams
 - ii. Boys: 8 teams
 - iii. Total players: 191
 - iv. New compliance guidelines have been set for SAY including Safe-Sport. Commissioners will be following up on compliance
 - v. New uniforms were purchased for this season. Last purchase of soccer uniforms was over 6 years ago.
 - b. Softball will start in Mid- April
 - i. Teams: 3
 - ii. Players: 39
 - iii. No new cost to field rental- the 2020 fee was transferred to 2021.
 - c. Baseball will start in early April.
 - i. Teams: 8
 - ii. 96 players
 - iii. There will be no 'Kid Glove' revenue this year from the Reds due to limitation in fans at the stadium.
 - d. Little Sports:
 - i. Soccer registration has opened.
 - ii. Basketball and Volleyball will be resume in 2021-2022 school year.
- 3. Facilities:
 - a. Gym stage pads will be removed in April or May to be refurbished.
 - b. Gym floor will be sanded and refinished with new graphics in June/July.
 - c. Gym ceiling will be painted to a light color prior to gym refinishing to brighten gym space
 - d. New lock has been for the concession stand in the gym. New lock has an easily changed code for security and will have an auto lock deadbolt.
 - e. Replacing gym doors for security remains on our budget.

PTO – Update to Parish Council February 2021

- Volunteers remain unable to be inside school buildings and most school events are not being held this year, so volunteer opportunities have been significantly limited.
- Very active Teacher Appreciation Committee has been organizing monthly "treats" to keep up teacher morale and ensure they know families are supporting their efforts this year. Activities they've spearheaded include:
 - Amazon Teacher Wishlist containing everything from snacks to teacher supplies to hand warmers
 - Weekly Teacher "Love Letters" sent in by families
 - Amazing SMS Educator Yard Signs
 - 100th Day of School balloons and virtual messages from over 100 students listing all the ways they are grateful for St. Mary teachers.
 - Catholic Schools Week Teacher Appreciation Luncheon catered by the Wheel
- Teacher's Christmas Fund raised \$23, 875, which included participation from 236 families (88% of school families).
- Spirit wear and Virtual Christmas Shop have been very successful this year. However, we have had delays in receiving amounts due from vendors and have been working to resolve this.
- All funds raised from the Virtual Christmas Shop have been directed towards indoor and outdoor recess equipment and supplies for classes such as balls, jump ropes, board games, decks of cards, bubbles, and crafts. Teachers have also requested a storage container to keep outdoor recess equipment and working to supply that as well.
- In February, PTO hosted first Virtual Cooking Night for families. Sean Laudeman and Brian Geeding lead the night and 60+ families participated. We have received great feedback and are considering hosting a follow up night.
- Recent Expenditures include:
 - o Yard Signs
 - o Teacher Luncheon
 - 8th Grade French Fry Friday
 - o Recess Supplies
- In March the Nomination Committee will meet to select the slate of officers for next year's PTO Board. Open positions for this year are: Vice President, Auditor, Correspondence Secretary, and President-Elect.
- Upcoming Events/Activities include:

 - o Possible Family Art Night either virtually or "take home" activity
 - o Easter Cookies sale

 - Reviewed Financial Results (including reduction in weekly offerings), Facility and Technology needs for Church and School
 - Discussed how best to move forward to address all the needs
- 2020-21 FY Parish wide weekly giving ask initiated in January 2021

St. Mary School Update Parish Council February 2021

Faculty

- Mrs. Jen Reker-Murphy was announced as Principal following her Interim Principal appointment that began on July 13, 2020. Jen successfully opened the school in the middle of the pandemic, completed in person 5 days per week instruction to date*, and has met and exceeded standards put forth by the AOC.
 - *Covid case information for the school has been posted on the front page of the website per the health department order. There has been zero spread inside the school. Cases all occurred from household and outside community exposure.

- Faculty and staff will receive their second Covid vaccine dose on Wednesday, March 3.
- Actively working the Accreditation process for St. Mary School. In October 2021, we will have a review by an outside committee. The AOC is providing guidance.
- Teachers letter of intent for the 2021-22 school year were due on February 26. Any available positions will be posted on the AOC website and due diligence will be given to hiring including Fr. Ken, grade level teachers and others in the process.
 - A Campus Ministry role is being introduced in the 2021-22 school year utilizing our local talented Jr. High Teacher, Sean Laudeman, and faith centered inspiring youth organizer, Brian Geeding. These fine educators will be working with students in K-8 on faith retreats, community service, and infusing Catholic teachings into their lives and the lives of their families.

St. Mary School Update continued

Enrollment

Enrollment for the current school year 2020-2021 was closed in early June 2020 to allow safe social distancing practices to be put in place. Current school enrollment: **451**

- Current student re-enrollment was completed in February and offers of placement have been sent to new students. We have had an extraordinary amount of interest and new student registrations for 2021-22 due to the public-school closures etc. Many grade levels currently have waiting lists.
- With guidance from the AOC, and in consideration of continued social distancing practices, enrollment for most grades was capped at 54 (minus Kindergarten where it was determined that capacity could be managed and any grades that already had current students enrolled.) Next year school enrollment projection: **475**

Annual Fund

- Results to date: **\$136,543.78** / 285 gifts. The Annual Fund year ends on June 30.
