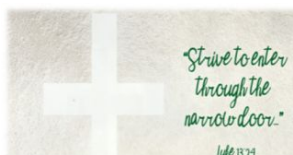

The Pastor's Corner

First Day of School

The new school semester starts this month. One of the things that I value most about the schools in our family is that our students get a Catholic education. Their education here gives them the fullness of the faith and teaches them to witness and evangelize our beliefs as Catholics. Our schools pursue excellence in academic and spiritual growth. Although we have high academic expectations, what we really want to see flourish in our students is their ability to make a difference by bringing the word of God out into the world. We want them to be able to live and grow in the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Let us all resolve to renew these gifts and be an example to our children.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit according to Catholic Tradition are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of God. The standard interpretation has been the one that St. Thomas Aquinas worked out in the thirteenth century in his *Summa Theologiae*:

- Wisdom is both the knowledge of and judgment about “divine things” and the ability to judge and direct human affairs according to divine truth (I/I.1.6; I/II.69.3; II/II.8.6; II/II.45.1–5).
- Understanding is penetrating insight into the very heart of things, especially those higher truths that are necessary for our eternal salvation—in effect, the ability to “see” God (I/I.12.5; I/II.69.2; II/II.8.1–3).
- Counsel allows a man to be directed by God in matters necessary for his salvation (II/II.52.1).
- Fortitude denotes a firmness of mind in doing good and in avoiding evil, particularly when it is difficult or dangerous to do so, and the confidence to overcome all obstacles, even deadly ones, by virtue of the assurance of everlasting life (I/II.61.3; II/II.123.2; II/II.139.1).
- Knowledge is the ability to judge correctly about matters of faith and right action, so as to never wander from the straight path of justice (II/II.9.3).
- Piety is, principally, revering God with filial affection, paying worship and duty to God, paying due duty to all men on account of their relationship to God, and honoring the saints and not contradicting Scripture. The Latin word *pietas* denotes the reverence that we give to our father and to our country; since God is the Father of all, the worship of God is also called piety (I/II.68.4; II/II.121.1).

Fear of God is, in this context, “filial” or chaste fear whereby we revere God and avoid separating ourselves from him—as opposed to “servile” fear, whereby we fear punishment (I/II.67.4; II/II.19.9).

Purpose:

The Elderly and Homebound Ministry provides a social connection between the parish and those in need. This ministry, through volunteer effort, contacts parish members who reside in residences, nursing facilities, and other home situations. Ministry volunteers offer a listening ear and a comforting presence to those who are ill or homebound. The goal is to offer parishioners an encounter with one another to experience God's goodness and to continue the connection to St. Mary Parish.

What is the scope of the ministry?

Through home visits, reassuring phone calls, and sending cards and bulletins regularly, the parish volunteers will engage the elderly/homebound person through conversation, social, and spiritual support. Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 13:24, 30. *Strive to enter through the narrow gate...For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.*

In today's gospel reading Jesus responds to a man who asks, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" Two parts of Jesus' answer stood out to me.

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate."

The definition of strive is to "make great efforts to achieve or obtain something; to struggle or fight vigorously." Jesus knew that following his teachings would not be easy. Work, family commitments, and other temptations can disrupt our prayer life and our efforts to live the two great commands: to love God and our neighbors. So, Jesus has made it clear, we need to put in the work to get through that gate.

"For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."

When I read this line, I was thinking of Jesus' interactions with various Pharisees and scribes mentioned in the gospels. They were either trying to trip up Jesus by asking him what they thought were clever, trick questions about the law (and always failing in their effort); or they were criticizing him for eating and spending time with sinners. Jesus typically saw them as hypocrites, acting better than everyone else because of

their education and lofty position. I think Jesus had the Pharisees and scribes in mind when he talked about some people who appear to be first in line actually being last.

Jesus preached humbleness and being of service to others. Jesus expects that from us. He calls us to be humble servants of God, praying regularly and persistently, being kind, withholding judgement, helping others, especially the less fortunate in our world, and asking forgiveness when we sin. It's not easy, but today's gospel reminds us we must make a great effort to stay on the narrow path that Jesus laid out for us.
