

You are invited to the Marzheuser Lecture featuring Dr. Gary Anderson on Wednesday, September 28 at 7:30

p.m. in the Bartlett Center. Dr. Anderson is the Hesburgh Professor of Catholic Thought at the University of Notre Dame.

Catholic theology makes a significant distinction between enduring a punishment for one's sins and making satisfaction. Dr. Anderson's lecture, "The Penance of King David" will illustrate how this distinction can illuminate the story of David's penance after his dalliance with Bathsheba and how it might inform our own understanding of the Rite of Reconciliation.

Dr. Anderson holds a doctoral degree from Harvard University. His research focuses on the Hebrew scriptures and how they were received in Jewish and Christian communities. He

has authored numerous publications, including Sin: A History (2009), Charity: The Place of the Poor in the Biblical Tradition (2013) and Christian Doctrine and the Old Testament (2017).

The event will include Holy Mass with the opportunity to venerate a first-class relic of St. Gerard, the patron saint of mothers, followed by presentations, and fellowship. KNOW YOUR SAINTS: St. George (d. c. 303)

If Mary Magdalene was the victim of misunderstanding, George is the object of a vast amount of imagination. There is every reason to believe that he was a real martyr who suffered at Lydda in Palestine, probably before the time of Constantine. The Church adheres to his memory, but not to the legends surrounding his life.

That he was willing to pay the supreme price to follow Christ is what the Church believes. And it is enough. The story of George's slaying the dragon, rescuing the king's daughter and converting Libya is a 12th-century Italian fable. George was a favorite patron saint of crusaders, as well as of Eastern soldiers in earlier times. He is a patron saint of England, Portugal, Germany, Aragon, Catalonia, Genoa and Venice.

THE WORD IN YOUR HEART | 11

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 16:10. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones.

Jesus taught through sometimes perplexing parables. Today's gospel involves a convoluted story involving a master and his corrupt, albeit savvy, steward which ends with, "You cannot serve both God and mammon [wealth]." A fairly heavy moral lesson which has been parsed as, "You cannot serve two masters; you have to choose between God and money."

But I like to think this story of the shrewd servant is more about stewardship and honesty. We are all stewards of God's gifts, including our own talents and treasure—and, more broadly, even our planet's resources. We are entrusted as stewards for the benefit of ourselves and others, into the future, as Jesus implores us never to squander these gifts during our brief time on earth.

Two lines come to me when contemplating today's gospel. The first is from The Profit (a parody of Kahlil Gibran's The Prophet): "I have seen the future and it is just like the present, only longer."

The second, and far more profound, is from Archbishop Schnurr's vocation prayer that we recite in Mass:

"You have created us for some definite purpose. Grant us the grace to know the path You have planned for us in this life and to respond with a generous 'Yes.'"

Let us strive to be trustworthy in all matters, and responsible stewards of the gifts we have been given. ~ Douglas Frueh


