The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. 

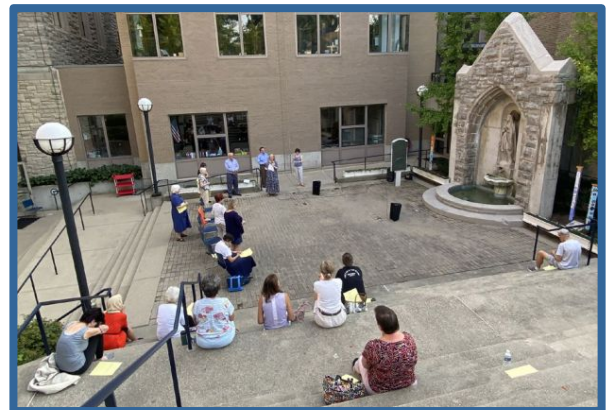

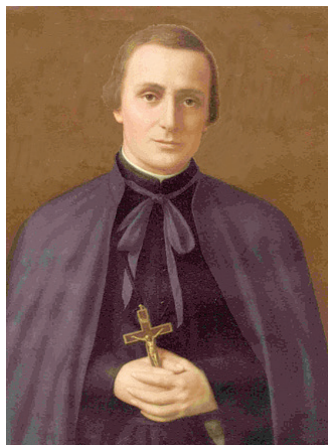

KNOW YOUR SAINTS: St. Peter Chanel (1803-1841)

Anyone who has worked in loneliness, with great adaptation required and with little apparent success, will find a kindred spirit in Peter Chanel.

As a young priest he revived a parish in a “bad” district by the simple method of showing great devotion to the sick. Wanting to be a missionary, he joined the Society of Mary (Marists) at 28. Obediently, he taught in the seminary for five years. Then, as superior of seven Marists, he traveled to Western Oceania. The bishop accompanying the missionaries left Peter and a brother on Futuna Island (northeast of Fiji), promising to return in six months. He was gone five years.

Meanwhile, Peter struggled with this new language and mastered it, making the difficult adjustment to life with whalers, traders, and warring natives. Despite little apparent success and severe want, he maintained a serene and gentle spirit, plus endless patience and courage. A few natives had been baptized, a few more were being instructed. When the chieftain’s son asked to be baptized, persecution by the chieftain reached a climax. Father Chanel was clubbed to death.

Within two years after his death, the whole island became Catholic and has remained so. Peter Chanel is the first martyr of Oceania and its patron.



The Penance of King David

You are invited to the Marzheuser Lecture featuring Dr. Gary Anderson on **Wednesday, September 28 at 7:30 p.m. in the Bartlett Center**. Dr. Anderson is the Hesburgh Professor of Catholic Thought at the University of Notre Dame.

Catholic theology makes a significant distinction between enduring a punishment for one’s sins and making satisfaction. Dr. Anderson’s lecture, “**The Penance of King David**” will illustrate how this distinction can illuminate the story of David’s penance after his dalliance with Bathsheba and how it might inform our own understanding of the Rite of Reconciliation.

Dr. Anderson holds a doctoral degree from Harvard University. His research focuses on the Hebrew scriptures and how they were received in Jewish and Christian communities. He has authored numerous publications, including *Sin: A History* (2009), *Charity: The Place of the Poor in the Biblical Tradition* (2013) and *Christian Doctrine and the Old Testament* (2017).

The Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Amos 6:1. "Woe to the complacent in Zion!"

It is easy to be complacent. But that is not where God calls us. Sometimes we have the self-awareness to push ourselves out of our complacency. More often, God gives us the shove we need. These moments are can be spiritually, mentally, and sometimes even physically traumatic. At these times, pray for the grace to see the work of the Good Shepherd.



Think of Beacons of Light as such a shove. Beforehand, in many ways, we were complacent. I certainly was.
