#### Prayer for Vocations


Almighty Father, You have created for us some definite purpose.




## Lent Wake Up Series

The series begins this coming Saturday, February 25. The main theme this year is *The Laity in the Church*. The first speaker is Fr. David Endres, professor of Church History at Mt. St. Mary Seminary and a nationally-known speaker. His topic: *Branches of a Single Vine: The Laity in the Life of the Church*. The Church emphasizes the role of the lay faithful as being in communion — with the Trinity, with the Church, and with one another. This introduction to "communion" theology will offer practical reflections on how we can deepen our relationship to God with and through the Church. Gather in Robisch Hall at 9 AM for coffee and donuts, and the presentation is from 9:15 to 10:15 AM.

## **Introducing the Oratory: A Little History**

Did you know that St. Anthony Church was founded in 1859 by German farmers who had previously driven over an hour each Sunday to St. Francis de Sales, the closest Catholic Church at the time? The church was originally named St. Michael's, in honor of Michael Bückel, the leader of the church-building project. St. Michael's cemetery still exists at the intersection of Erie Avenue and Settle Street. In 1874 the current church building was built to accommodate the growing community, and was named St. Anthony in honor of pastor, Fr. Anthony Walburg, who had been the first Cincinnati-born German seminarian. In January of 1891, the church was completely gutted by fire. It was rebuilt in only 9 months, and rededicated on October 4, 1891, by Archbishop Purcell. In 2024 the church building will celebrate its 150th anniversary.



## Catechesis (kat'i-ke'sis) n.

#### The Stole

The stole is the distinctive element of the raiment of the ordained minister and it is always worn in the celebration of the sacraments and sacramentals. It is a strip of material that is embroidered, according to the norm, whose color varies with respect to the liturgical season or feast day.

Putting on the stole, the priest recites this prayer: "Lord, restore the stole of immortality, which I lost through the collusion of our first parents, and, unworthy as I am to approach Thy sacred mysteries, may I yet gain eternal joy."

Since the stole is an article of enormous importance, which, more than any other garment, indicates

the state of ordained office, one cannot but lament the abuse, that is now quite widespread, in which the priest does not wear a stole when he wears a chasuble.



During Lent, we will pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday at 9:30 AM and 7 PM at St. Cecilia and on Thursdays after the 5:30 PM Mass at St. Mary. During this special devotion, through meditation and prayer, we will walk with our Savior on his way of suffering from the time he was condemned to death until he died


and was buried. Making this devotion part of your Lenten commitment to prayer will help you grow closer to Christ.

## Fast and Abstinence Guidelines for Lent

**Ages 18-59:** Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting allows one full meal a day. **Ages 14 and up**: Abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

This prayer service will include the solemn closing of the back altar doors, the addition of violet décor to the sanctuary and the singing of the last "Alleluia." The prayers will conclude with the burning of last year's palms. The ashes of the palms will be used for the Masses on Ash Wednesday. An ice cream social will immediately follow the service.



## Seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:48. So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.

In 2014, Pope Francis told some pilgrims at the General Audience in St. Peter's Square, "We are called to be saints." God's goal for us is perfection. No pressure. What would perfect look like? In reading about the lives of various saints, I am immediately drawn to the simplicity of their lives. So few attachments, so little concern for worldly daily worries, just the relentless drive toward the mission.

Could I do that? My initial reaction is, "That is impossible." But what if my life wasn't so complicated? What would my life look like if I were God's perfect instrument? It seems impossible because I would have to put down my mission and take up his, whatever that might be — like Francis Xavier, dropping everything and sailing to evangelize in India and Asia. Instead of focusing inward, I would have to focus outward. Perfect is simple but not easy.

Christian writer George MacDonald once wrote that "God is easy to please, but hard to satisfy." The same is true of the saints. Mother Teresa was never content. She was obsessed with the next one who needed her help, not the scores of people she had already blessed. Perfect is never finished.

Perfect is the goal, but only Jesus was able to attain it. For us, the key might be to get a little better each day. It could be becoming more prayerful, more compassionate, or less attached to our worldly possessions. Just so long as each step takes us closer to his perfect vision.




