


40s Plus Fun Bunch SAVE THE DATES!


PART 3: Greatest Prayer of the Church

All the Sacraments are "visible signs that participate in invisible realities." They are all personal encounters with the risen, living Jesus Christ. All the Sacraments have this in common, but why does the Church refer to the Sacrament of the Eucharist, also known as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, as the greatest prayer of the Church?

It is the prayer of and by Jesus, "through Him, with Him and in Him." At the Last Supper, Jesus told the apostles to "do this in memory of me." But he was not only talking of that meal but of the sacrifice to follow. **The Mass is both a sacrifice and a meal.** It is important to understand that the Mass is a prayer given to us by Jesus. He is also acting as the principle agent. The Mass is an action of the living, risen Christ. As such, it is not ours to change but was given to us by Christ. *The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* says that nothing may be added or removed from the Mass, not even by a priest.

Through the Mass we join our sacrifices, bread, wine, joys and sufferings, to those of Christ's and these are offered by Him to God the Father for the Father's glorification and, in the process, we are made holy, or sanctified. We are also strengthened spiritually by being fed on the Word and Body of Christ and then sent out on a mission to make our society a little more like Heaven in preparation for His second coming when we will be at home. Until then, we are a pilgrim people on a journey toward the banquet of the Lamb.

The Mass does all these things "through Him, with Him and in Him" and that is why it is the greatest prayer of the Church.



Know Your Saints:

St. Joseph of Cupertino (1603-1663)


Joseph is most famous for levitating at prayer.

Already as a child, Joseph showed a fondness for prayer. After a short career with the Capuchins, he joined the Conventuals. Following a brief assignment caring for the friary mule, Joseph began his studies for the priesthood. Though studies were very difficult for him, Joseph gained a great deal of knowledge from prayer. He was ordained in 1628.

Joseph's tendency to levitate during prayer was sometimes a cross; some people came to see this much as they might have gone to a circus sideshow. Joseph's gift led him to be humble, patient and obedient, even though at times he was greatly tempted and felt forsaken by God. He fasted and wore iron chains for much of his life.

The friars transferred Joseph several times for his own good and for the good of the rest of the community. He was reported to and investigated by the Inquisition; the examiners exonerated him.

Joseph was canonized in 1767. In the investigation preceding the canonization, 70 incidents of levitation are recorded.

THE WORD IN YOUR HEART | 7

Sixth Sunday of Easter

John 14:18. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you.

When our children were young and my husband and I had to travel without them, usually for business, I always spent a lot of time before we left not just giving them instructions (and occasionally bribes) for good behavior in our absence, but reassuring them that they would be safe and cared for by the relative or baby sitter who would be staying with them. In today's gospel Jesus, preparing to leave his earthly life, is reassuring his disciples that even though he will no longer be in this world they will be cared for and he will be with them. "I will not leave you orphans...I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you."

We hear today that Philip used signs and wonders to convince the Samaritans to believe and accept the word of God (Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8). I think those would terrify and bewilder me. I just need to listen to and heed the gentle instruction that Jesus spoke—as one would to a child—to his beloved apostles, to all of us: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." And the promise that followed: "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always."

God's love for us is as unfathomable as Jesus' great sacrifice for our redemption. And we cannot fully comprehend the Advocate, "the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept." But the reason for our hope of salvation lies in the instructions and promises we hear today. ~Janet Buening




