

A special election in August will ask voters to decide whether the threshold to amend the Ohio Constitution should be elevated from a simple majority to a 60% "yes" vote. The best strategy to stop the abortion amendment is to **vote "Yes" on August 8.**

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that "human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception." The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like *Walking with Moms in Need* and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio.

Getting the pro-life vote to the polls will be key to protecting Ohio's Constitution from outside dark money groups that want to enshrine abortion through all nine months while taking away parental rights, as well as advancing the transgender agenda.





THE WORD IN YOUR HEART | 11

Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

John 6:56. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."

When Jesus ascended to heaven he did not leave us alone. On Pentecost, he sent us the gift of the Holy Spirit to always be with us. And while he was still on earth he gave us himself in the Eucharist. Today is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, celebrating the gift that Jesus gave us at the Last Supper — his Body and Blood truly present in the form of the bread and wine.

The focal point when the Early Church gathered was on receiving the Eucharist. The first Christians came together each week to celebrate the Breaking of the Bread. For them, the Eucharist was a verb, an action. They are the bread and drank the wine. They consumed the Body and Blood of Jesus and became one with him. They gave thanks for all that Jesus had done for them. They then went out and lived as Jesus taught.

These were the disciples, the followers of Jesus. We too today are disciples. What does it mean to be a follower? Remember that old summer game we played as children — Follow the Leader? Each child had to do exactly what the leader did, or else they were eliminated. That is our call: to follow our leader, Jesus Christ — and do exactly what he did.

The summer months are the Ordinary Time in the Church year. Each Sunday the gospel recounts the works and actions of Jesus— the same works and actions that we are called to put into our lives. When we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist, we become one with him, and are called to live as he lived. It is a challenge, but we have all of the help we need. Jesus is one with us. *Constant Constant Const*
