



History of the Holy Rood Work of Art

The Holy Rood [crucifix], the only one of its kind in the United States, has attracted so much attention that churches in Lynn and Washington have asked permission to reproduce it. It hangs suspended high above the stone communion rail, its carving and its color being among the most brilliant achievements of that master artist, Kirschmeyer. The figure of the Christ, superbly carved, stands out from a flame-like background, those of the Virgin and Saint John represented beneath, while the emblems of the four evangelists inspire the decoration and the detail of this symbolic emblem, one of the most striking in the church.

UNDERSTANDING THE MASS Part 8: The Mass as a Banquet

"Many are invited, but few are chosen." These are the words of Jesus Christ in Matthew 22:14. He was telling the chief priests and elders a parable about the Kingdom of Heaven as a wedding banquet. There are also many passages in Sacred Scripture about the time after the second coming of Jesus, which is referred to as the Banquet of the Lamb.

At every Mass, communion is also referred to as the wedding feast or a foretaste of the Banquet of the Lamb. At this banquet, we have participated in Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, have witnessed his coming as the bread and wine are turned into His Body and Blood and become one with him by consuming Him at Holy Communion. However, unlike normal food that becomes part of us after we eat it, this food has a divine component that causes us to become part of it. We consume the Sacred Body and Precious Blood of Christ, are nourished spiritually and become "little Christs". We are united with Christ and strengthened to be able to go out into society carrying Christ in our hearts to make the Earth a little closer to Heaven in preparation for His second coming.

Mass reaches its high point with this banquet, but that is not the only place during the Mass where we are fed. During the Liturgy of the Word, especially during the proclamation of the Gospel, Jesus is present and we are fed and strengthened spiritually. In order for this to happen, we must listen to the words as they are proclaimed. We must allow the Holy Spirit to work within us. We must keep our minds and hearts open to the graces of God that flow to us through our hearing of His Word. As strange as it sounds, during the Liturgy of the Word we must consume the presence of Christ through our ears.

The Mass is truly a banquet for all of our senses. Our nourishment is in the form of grace but, like all the other Sacraments, in order for the maximum grace to be fruitfully received, we must be adequately prepared, free of distraction and participate fully, actively and consciously.

THE WORD IN YOUR HEART | 11

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Romans 5:15. How much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many.

Today's readings portray God in many — seemingly contradictory — ways. They show him as a righteous avenger, compassionate champion of the poor, and sacrificing father. Instead of looking at them individually and trying to determine which descriptors are correct, I suggest we look at them in total and reflect on the reality that God is all these things and much, much more.

God's kindness is so bountiful, and his knowledge of us so complete, he will give us what we need. First, however, we must open ourselves to this grace. For most of us, this is a long spiritual journey. For a few of us, it's also a physical journey.
