Marian Triptych in the Sanctuary

The carved frame for the portrait of Mary in the sanctuary of church is most unusual. The inner frame is a series of flories, the center of the fleur-de-lis. At regular intervals in the center portion of the frame are rectangular patterned carvings in sequence. The outer portion of the frame is ribbed. At each side of the top, within the frame itself, are angel images in bas relief. Every bit of wood in the church is English oak.

The painting of Mary is unique because she is not wearing a veil. This portrait, flanked on either side by a similar one of an angel, forms a triptych [a three-paneled work of art, usually hinged so it may be folded]. This triptych style is repeated in each of the side altars. The angels in the main triptych are more Italian, said to be of the Fra Angelica school. But we return to English style with the four bas relief figures that border vertically the central portrait. These figures may be the four evangelists (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) and two bishops—likely Augustine and Jerome, who are often portrayed together.








BOOK REVIEW



Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 10:37-38. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me.

I do not have my own children. I do not know what that exactly feels like. I do know the deep love I have for children who are and are not blood related to me. I have twelve nieces and nephews. I also have children who are not in my family who I consider family. I have had the privilege to be an intimate part of these kids' lives to the point that I feel like they are my own. I know how attached I can get to the love I give them and receive from them.

The love and devotion that a parent feels for a child is all consuming. Until a certain age, a child is an extension of his or her parents. The child first blooms on the tree of the parents. It must be the greatest thing to feel and witness as a parent. The divine mirror is held up to them through the lives of their children.

This is where Jesus's words in the gospel are hard to hear. Parents may become attached to their children in a way that stunts both the child and the parent's growth. The love that has grown and overflowed between parent and child eventually is asked to be shared with the world, to be given back to God's greater plan. It is our Christian mission to not hoard or keep the blooms of love to ourselves. True love also means to let go.

Children have their own special mission and identity that reveals itself. They must find out for themselves what God is calling them to do and be.


