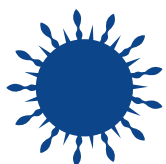

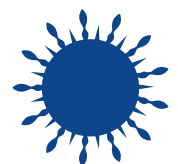



News from The Oratory of Saint John Vianney



St. Vincent DePaul Update: Thank you for your generous donations to the Oratory Conference of the St. Vincent DePaul Society, serving neighbor clients in the 45227 area. Through our work we strive to create “a network of friends, inspired by gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need.”

We've had a busy and productive 2023 so far! Each month we assist an average of 35 to 40 people, providing assistance with utilities paid to Duke and GC Water Works, as well as rental assistance in collaboration with landlords, the Emergency Rental program (ERA2) at Bank St., and other agencies including MEAC in Madisonville. New beds and vouchers for furniture, clothing, and bedding are provided through our partnership with SVDP central office. We also deliver 25-40 bags of food on a monthly basis and work with others to keep our pantry stocked.

We have regular collections on the third Sunday of each month and are grateful for your generous support! Neighbors in need of assistance can call our SVDP at (513) 271-0856.

We have eight active members and welcome you to join us! Our meetings are the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month from 7-8 pm. If interested, or for more information, contact president, Jim Losekamp at jimlosekamp@gmail.com or (513) 546-9191.

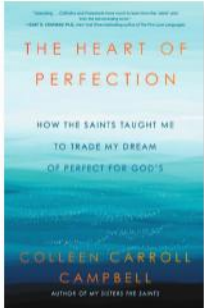

The Heart of Perfection: How the Saints Taught Me to Trade My Dream of Perfect for God's

THE WORD IN YOUR HEART | 11

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Zechariah 9:10. The warrior's bow shall be banished, and he shall proclaim peace to the nations.

It's funny. We sometimes hear about the "war machine" and how some individuals make their dollars off of bullets and armor: "blood money," so to speak. Yet, last year, when Russia invaded Ukraine, the stock market went down. Essentially, war is bad for business. Instead of creating products and services and selling them in the global market, potential consumers are going to war, rations are placed on citizens, the economy shuts down. Who's going to buy your bread if there are no mouths to eat it?

In today's readings, we hear about God's plan and how he will end war. Living in Christ, as Saint Paul puts it, will bring that peace. For "God is love," and love never fails. If God is with us, who could be against us? But how...how can something as old as time like war come to an end? I remember hearing in grade school that some people thought life would be "boring" without war. Either they were too accustomed to war, or not enough.

In our gospel today, Jesus makes it clear, "I will give you rest." No more fighting your brother, no more weeping mothers. As *The Who* put it, "I don't need to fight to prove I'm right." Jesus is the Prince of Peace, the Lord of love. An America at peace is something quite special, something to strive for. I know "freedom isn't free" but neither is war: PTSD, missing limbs, missing comrades. While a "just war" is still being debated in our Church, I thank all our veterans. If I can quote another lad from across the pond, "Give peace a chance." ~Sean McFadden
