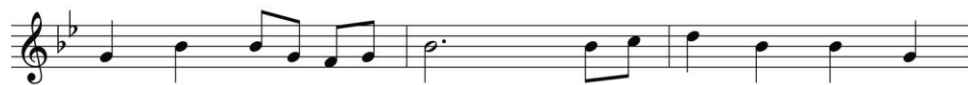

The Oratory of Saint John Vianney

The Oratory is part of St. Cecilia parish, and we are a growing community, dedicated to expanding the Catholic presence in Madisonville, and devoted to prayer for the priests of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, through the intercession of St. John Vianney.

An oratory is a place for divine worship designated by the bishop for the benefit of a community, to which other members of the faithful can also come. An oratory is similar to a chapel, but is public, whereas a chapel is private.

Mass is offered Monday-Friday at 11:45 am, and the rosary begins at 11:15 for the special intention of the priests of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Fr. Anthony encouraged us all to try to attend one more time per week than we are now — what a great chance in the middle of the day to refocus on the Lord.

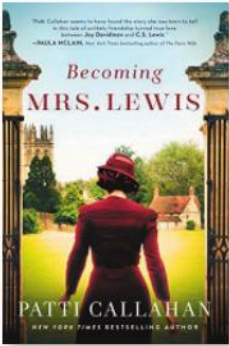

Becoming Mrs. Lewis By Patti Callahan





There are certain faith-filled couples that we just love to love: the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph, St. Louis and Zelie, St. Gianna Molla and Pietro. But it can be so hard to find books that portray these good, wholesome, God-centered courtships and eventual marriages. Enter *Becoming Mrs. Lewis*. If you think you know Joy and "Jack" from the 1993

film *Shadowlands*, think again. Immerse yourself in the story of C.S. Lewis' beloved wife, who inspired his later works *Surprised by Joy* and *A Grief Observed*, and how she came to conversion and deep Christian faith because of him. THE WORD IN YOUR HEART | 11

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 13:31-32. *“The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the ‘birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches.’”*

Growing up I always associated the mustard seed with quantities of faith: “If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, ‘Move from here to there and it will move’” (Matthew 17:20). But darn it, I don’t. Not always. Not when grief or fear knock the wind out of me. And then I’d beat myself up. *I can’t even muster a mustard seed*, I’d think.

But I don’t have to. Or at least not in the way I thought. Because in today’s gospel, Matthew instructs us to plant a mustard seed to grow the kingdom of God. It’s an invitation to *do* (not to *have*) “small things with great love,” as Mother Theresa said. I can request a Mass intention or drop off a meal *even when* I’m full of questions and doubt, because “love is not something for which to search or wait or hope or dream. It’s simply something to do,” as author Glennon Doyle says.

Faith, hope, and love are interconnected (1 Corinthians 13:13), so perhaps faith works this way, too. Maybe faith can be something we *do*. Planting a seed means trusting that good will grow from it – that it will buoy the person you helped, while simultaneously lifting you up. After all, in God’s kingdom, it is in giving that we receive. And the reverse is true: it is in receiving that we give – asking for and accepting help invites others to be God’s instruments.

Here’s the thing with the mustard seed – if you sow it, God takes care of the rest. You plant it, and it germinates, sprouts, shoots up, and birds nest in it. And that’s faith in action. ~Christina Webster Stanek
