




## Sisters on the Way September 10, 2023

Hopefully by now you know that we will have three Franciscan Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary joining our parish family in October. Their congregation was founded in 1844 and has over 1,200 sisters in their order. Their charism is the "sanctification of sisters for the sanctification of women." They follow the spirituality of St. Francis of Assisi and strongly believe in the education of women. I have been talking about how we have spiritual fathers in our family of parishes and would like to add spiritual mothers who would be a great support for the priests, parishioners and the schools. The plan is to have three of the sisters teaching in our schools this fall: Sr. Arulmozhi Mariadoss, Sr. Gracy Sacharaiyas and Sr. Marti-

na. An additional sister will coming later next year. They will be teaching at the schools as well as being part of the everyday parish life and events. They will reside in a house on the St. Mary campus that is being prepared with the help of parishioners and staff.

Please keep them in your prayers as they go through the transition of coming to this country from their homeland of India and starting their ministry in the eastside family.

## From the Oratory of Saint John Vianney

The Oratory is part of St. Cecilia Parish and dedicated to expanding the Catholic presence in Madisonville, and devoted to prayer for the priests of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, through the intercession of St. John Vianney, patron of parish priests.

#### The Chair of St. John Vianney

You may have wondered about the chair of St. John Vianney that is in the sanctuary at the Oratory. This chair came to us from the Trappist Fathers at Gethsemani, Kentucky. The monks at Gethsemani are of the Benedictine Order from Cluny, France. When they sailed to America they brought a few items with them to keep their homeland alive in their hearts. John Vianney's chair remained a permanent fixture in the sanctuary of their chapel until many years later when remodeling work was being done. The chair was placed in the attic for safe keeping and consequently was stored there after the work was done. In the 1980s, when Cure of Ars School was staffed by Franciscan Brothers, Br. Gary Skibinski and another brother went to Gethsemani for a Holy Week retreat. Fr. Gabriel, the rector at Gethsemani at the time, offered the chair to Br. Gary to bring back to St. John Vianney Parish. The Tankersly family offered to make the trip to Kentucky to retrieve the chair, which was placed in the sanctuary at St. John Vianney, later at St. Margaret-St. John Parish, and now at the Oratory of St. John Vianney. It was recently authenticated and certified to be a chair originally from the kitchen of St. John Vianney. Its presence inspires us to imitate the great love St. John Vianney had for God and for the souls entrusted to his care. - adapted from a History of St. John Vianney Parish

## The Catechist's Corner

*The Privilege of Being a Woman* by Alice von Hildebrand



The Privilege of Being a Woman Marson Million Though published over two decades ago, Alice von Hildebrand's critique of the modern feminist movement is perhaps more pertinent today than ever before. In *The Privilege of Being a Woman*, Hildebrand beautifully portrays God's gift of womanhood and femininity. She calls upon the saints, including St. Thérèse and St. Augustine, to challenge the secular notion that the Church diminishes the role of women. The high regard that the Church does hold for femininity is epitomized in the Bless-

ed Mother, who embodies the privilege that women have in society and in the Lord's eyes. She, in her complete grace and humility, was chosen as the living tabernacle of His Beloved Son, exemplifying the elevated status of women in God's creation. I particularly loved Hildebrand's rebuttal to earthly criticism of women and the emphasis that we place on emotions and matters of the heart, calling to mind the very Sacred Heart of Jesus that was pierced out of His love for us. In a time of secular belittlement of motherhood and misunderstood notions of womanhood, this was a read that amplified my pride in being a daughter of Christ. With the Blessed Mother as our perfect model of femininity, it is truly a privilege to be a woman — and to journey through this book together with our Young Adult Women's Small Groups this fall! 
