The Catechist's Corner

The Story of a Soul by St. Therese of Lisieux




I first came across *The Story of A Soul* in a very unexpected place. The book was sitting on the desk next me, with no apparent owner, in the back of a secular classroom filled with 11 year olds. It first caught my eye when I saw Therese's photograph on the front cover. I felt as though she was looking at me, daring me to pick up the book! While skimming through, I found a little card that said, "Love." Intrigued, I decided to buy a

copy for myself. In the book, Therese writes her memories out of obedience to her sister's wishes. Her sister was the Mother Superior of the Carmelite community she belonged to. Reading these deeply personal, childlike thoughts of this young girl really affected me. I was shown that it is possible to achieve sainthood by simply loving Our Lord, not by any particular merit of our own. She states: 'I am daringly confident that one day I shall become a great Saint. I am not relying on my own merits, because I haven't any. I hope in Him who is Virtue and Sanctity itself." Page after page, Therese speaks about her burning desire to love and please Jesus. She would say daring things about wanting to prove her Love by being a priest, a warrior, or to die a martyr's death, but she came to terms with her own way of expressing her love, like that of "a little child." Toward the end of her life she came to understand that her greatest works would be done after her earthly life. Even after she died, her heavenly vocation would be "love," bringing a multitude of souls to Jesus. After reading this book and especially on this feast of St. Therese, I feel as though I am one of those souls pursued to be brought closer to Christ by the "Little Flower." The Proposed Amendment Would Change The Ohio **Constitution To Permit Abortions** Up To The Time Of Birth.

The proposed amendment goes far beyond what was permitted under Roe v. Wade. One way it does so is by the use of the word "health." This word, which is intentionally undefined, will include anything that a pro-choice doctor is willing to state could harm a woman's/girl's "health" and permit abortions up to the time of birth.

Under the proposed amendment, in order for a girl or woman to have an abortion after "fetal viability," she would not be required to show that her life or health was actually at risk. All that she would need to do is find just one pro-abortion doctor anywhere in the country who is willing to state that, in his or her subjective, "professional judgment," the mere fact that a girl/woman wants an abortion is, by itself, enough to establish that the abortion is "necessary" to protect her life or health. Consequently, the number of post-viability abortions, including abortions up to the time of birth, would not be rare because their "necessity" will be determined by the subjective opinions of the most radical, pro-abortion doctors in this country. In short, because the proposed amendment does not have an objective, medical standard, it leaves the medical decision about the necessity for an abortion, including an abortion up to the time of birth, to pro-choice doctors based upon their subjective, pro-choice biases of what is needed to protect a girl's/woman's life or "health." WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and seeking an abortion.

An abortionproviding physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clea protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth "right to abortion" is necessary to preserv care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote

ARTICLE I. SECTION 22

The Right to Repri with Protections for Health and Safety

- carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing and abortion.
- The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional udgment of the pregnant patient's treating
- As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This determined on a case-by-case basis includes any governmental entity and political subdivisi
- 5. This Section is self-executing


