The First Sunday of Advent

December 3, 2023

The first Sunday of Advent is an exciting time in our church. It is the beginning of new hope and a wonderful build up to the birth of Christ Our Lord. At the end of this week, on Friday, December 8, we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The belief is that from the moment of conception, the Virgin Mary was free of original sin. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Mass times are: St. Cecilia: 9:00 AM, 12:10 PM, and 5:30 PM, St. Mary: 6:45 AM and 9:00 AM, and the Oratory: 11:45 AM.

The following week we have another beautiful feast day celebrating Our Lady of Guadalupe. It is the perfect time to celebrate the Blessed Mother throughout the month as we contemplate on the Birth of the Christ child. On Tuesday, December 12, there will be a Mass at St. Cecilia at 9 AM which will be celebrated in Spanish.

What a great way to start our Advent by taking time to celebrate these lovely feast days highlighting the gift of the Virgin Mary. Please join us as we walk through the four weeks of Advent.

Sunday, December 17 is Bambinelli Sunday, as well as Gaudate Sunday. Each year children gather with their families in St. Peter's Square for the "Bambinelli Sunday Blessing."

The children bring with them figures of the christ child—the bambinelli—from their family's nativity scene. The pope blesses the children and the figurines they have brought. Join us as we celebrate this same tradition in our eastside family of parishes and bring your baby Jesus figures from your nativity set. We will be doing the blessing at all of the Masses. This year the blessing will be at Masses on December 16 and 17.

I encourage you to take advantage of all these wonderful opportunities to celebrate our Faith during this Advent season.


BOOK REVIEW

THE CATECHIST'S CORNER

Where Have All the Fathers Gone? by Deacon Joe Grote

As a father to a child under the age of one, I often wonder if I am raising my child correctly. I've read plenty of academic research, in the search to be the best father to my daughter, that shows what would be considered "best outcomes" for children. The common factor amongst all of them is that the kids that grow up to be successful have present parents, specifically present fathers. Where Have All The Fathers Gone, a book by our own Deacon Joe Grote, is a collection of daily thoughts and reflections aimed to help fathers of all ages, from someone like myself with an infant, to fathers of multiple children, grandfathers, great-grandfathers, and even dads-to-be to understand the role of fatherhood that they have obtained. Each day has a theme, a thought, and a question to challenge the father to be a better dad than he was the day before. While I went into reading this expecting to have daily reflections that focused on fatherhood itself, I was pleasantly surprised when many days' reflection focused on the improvement of oneself instead. This makes me think of Matthew's Gospel when Jesus is teaching the Sermon on the Mount, "You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your own eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye." To be able to take care of others, we must be able to take care of ourselves and recognize where we need to improve. It is very easy to get caught up in the wants and desires of the world, to get stuck in the rut of everyday life, and to come home more exhausted than the day before. One thing that this book has helped me to do is to have the reminder, regardless of how bad my day was or how exhausted I am, to tell my family that I love them and to offer bits of self-sacrifice. So I'll ask you all, "Have you told your kids you love them today?" (Reviewed by Everett Mitchel)







A CASH GIFT in any amount is a convenient and popular way to show your faithful support for the church and our ministries. If you itemize, the full amount of your gift qualifies for a 2023 charitable income tax deduction. Make certain your check is dated 2023 and received or postmarked no later than December 31, 2023, to receive a deduction this year.

MAKE A GIFT WITH YOUR IRA Congress made the qualified charitable distribution (QCD) a permanent rule in 2015. It allows owners of a traditional IRA to exclude RMDs from their adjusted gross income (AGI) if they give the money to an approved charity, also known as a qualified charitable organization. The QCD rule allows you to give the amount you donate from your IRA directly to charity without ever receiving it as income. Therefore, you pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions. Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can reduce your annual income level. This may also help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax. Best of all, you can start taking QCDs at age 70½; you don't have to wait until you hit 73.

GIVING UNNEEDED LIFE INSURANCE Do you own an old life insurance policy that is no longer needed? Perhaps the purpose for the policy no longer exists (your children are grown, or your mortgage is paid off) or your financial situation has changed and mitigates the need for the insurance. Consider giving the policy to the church and receive a charitable income tax deduction for the lesser of your cost basis or the replacement value. This is a great way to benefit a cause you support without reducing your checking account. If the value is more than you wish to donate, consider cashing in the policy and giving a lesser portion. Your gift may sufficiently reduce or eliminate any potential taxes due from the sale. Please speak to your insurance advisor for more information.

Year-end is also the Christmas season. For many Catholics, this is an occasion to give in gratitude for God's greatest gift to us, Jesus Christ. In all our giving, let us never forget these familiar words, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son..." Why not make a special effort to honor Him in your giving this Christmas season—perhaps the most important gift you give? May God bless you as you make this expression of your faith.






