

BOOK REVIEW

The Catechist's Corner

The Glories of Mary by St. Alphonsus de Ligouri



One need not look far into the tradition of the Catholic Church to see its extreme love and devotion to our Lord's Blessed Mother. Alphonsus Liguori's *The Glories of Mary* has stood the test of time as a classic among Marian devotional books in this tradition. From the 7 Sorrows of Mary to her virtues to a line by line meditation on the Salve Regina, St. Alphonsus gives us a masterfully crafted guide to why we should love Mary. First of all, she is the Mother

of God. There is no one who loves Mary more than her Son, Jesus Christ. As we celebrate the feast of the Immaculate Conception, we are reminded of that love Jesus has for her. God, in creating his own mother, made her the most perfect and beautiful woman to ever live, free from the stain of Original Sin. Anything Mary asks of her Son is guaranteed to be given to her, leading St. Alphonsus to call Mary the "Treasurer of all Divine Graces." It is through the hands of Mary that God's grace flows onto his people because she is the most merciful of all the souls in heaven. Secondly, since Christ gave us his Mother to be our Mother, we are her children too. So, next to God himself, no one loves you more than Mary. She desires to bestow endless graces upon you from her Son and will always intercede for you before him if you have recourse to her. St. Alphonsus tells many stories throughout The Glories of Mary about how our Blessed Mother's intercession saved poor souls from damnation and how one word from her in favor of you silences all accusations the devil can throw at you. I cannot recommend this book highly enough for anyone searching for a way to deepen their devotion to Mary and, with the saints, fall in love with her. (Reviewed by David Homoelle)



YEAR-END GIVING | 10

A CASH GIFT in any amount is a convenient and popular way to show your faithful support for the church and our ministries. If you itemize, the full amount of your gift qualifies for a 2023 charitable income tax deduction. Make certain your check is dated 2023 and received or postmarked no later than December 31, 2023, to receive a deduction this year.

MAKE A GIFT WITH YOUR IRA Congress made the qualified charitable distribution (QCD) a permanent rule in 2015. It allows owners of a traditional IRA to exclude RMDs from their adjusted gross income (AGI) if they give the money to an approved charity, also known as a qualified charitable organization. The QCD rule allows you to give the amount you donate from your IRA directly to charity without ever receiving it as income. Therefore, you pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions. Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can reduce your annual income level. This may also help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax. Best of all, you can start taking QCDs at age 70¹/₂; you don't have to wait until you hit 73.

GIVING UNNEEDED LIFE INSURANCE

Do you own an old life insurance policy that is no longer needed? Perhaps the purpose for the policy no longer exists (your children are grown, or your mortgage is paid off) or your financial situation has changed and mitigates the need for the insurance. Consider giving the policy to the church and receive a charitable income tax deduction for the lesser of your cost basis or the replacement value. This is a great way to benefit a cause you support without reducing your checking account. If the value is more than you wish to donate, consider cashing in the policy and giving a lesser portion. Your gift may sufficiently reduce or eliminate any potential taxes due from the sale. Please speak to your insurance advisor for more information.

Year-end is also the Christmas season. For many Catholics, this is an occasion to give in gratitude for God's greatest gift to us, Jesus Christ. In all our giving, let us never forget these familiar words, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son..." Why not make a special effort to honor Him in your giving this Christmas season—perhaps the most important gift you give? May God bless you as you make this expression of your faith.

First Reading


IS 40:1-5, 9-11

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God.

As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, All make a profound bow:


> and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.
