#### From the Desk of Fr. Ken








#### PODCAST REVIEW

### The Catechist's Digital Corner








The Counsel of Trent (not to be confused with the 16th Century Council of Trent) is a podcast by famed Catholic apologist Trent Horn. Trent Horn is known for books such as *Why We're Catholic*, *The Case for Catholicism*, and *Answering Atheism*. He is one of the staff apologists for **Catholic Answers**, a website dedicated to defending the Catholic Faith and making resources accessible to everyone about answers to the Church's hardest questions. With a Master's degree in Theology, Philosophy, and Bioethics, Trent Horn uses his vault of knowledge related to the faith to tackle many objections to Church teaching on his podcast in 30 minutes or less. While his show is focused on theological topics (objections to Protestant doctrines, discussions on scripture, etc.), about once a month he will go over news from around the Catholic world and work to explain this issue to his audience. Additionally, he offers episodes titled "Free-for-all Fridays" where he will talk about whatever he wants to, or whatever his patrons have requested as a way to have a breath of fresh air after discussing big ticket issues. The Counsel of Trent is a great first podcast to get into and I highly recommend it if you are looking for an

introduction to Catholic apologetics. His podcast can be found on streaming services such as Spotify, Apple Music, Amazon Music, Audible, and YouTube. (*Reviewed by Everett Mitchel*)
