
Oratory Easter Egg Hunt Volunteers


From the Desk of Fr. Ken

THE CATECHIST'S CORNER


THE BIBLE IN A YEAR



The Bible in a Year podcast by Father Mike Schmitz seeks to provide listeners with a better understanding of scripture, the traditions of the Church, and how we are to live out scripture in our lives in daily bite sized pieces. Spanning all 365 days throughout the year, each 15-20 minute episode shows each account for different events that are highlighted throughout the books of the Bible. Fr. Schmitz begins in the Old Testament with the opening lines of Genesis and gradually works his way forward in salvation history, pairing narrative chapters with sections of wisdom literature to unlock new understanding and depth. What makes this experience of reading the Bible unique is that Father Schmitz provides historical, contextual, and theological insights into each daily scripture reading. By providing this additional information, this allows the listener to be truly immersed in the meaning of each day's passage. Additionally Fr. Schmitz does a great job of attempting to make the readings understandable for all levels of religious understanding. He

completely removes all barriers that may prevent one from grasping difficult or complex topics. Although Bible in a Year is written and hosted by Ascension Press, it is available on multiple media providers such as Spotify, Apple, and YouTube. Finally, if you are looking for the perfect gift for a friend, consider gifting them the companion book that goes with the podcast! I know they will thank you for looping them in on this trend that has risen to international acclaim! (Reviewed by John Roberts)
