## **Fathers Team**

Father's Team is a great ministry offered to any father of any age at St Mary. We meet on Friday mornings from 7-8 during the school year. We have a structured format that involves team signals, prayer, intentions and a topic that varies from week to week and covers the areas of Church, Community, God, Spouse, Children, Peers and is lead by a rotating team of individuals whose task is to introduce the topic with a little information and then to facilitate a discussion among the men present. Obviously, the secret sauce for a group like this is to sit in a circle with a dozen other fathers and dive deep into these topics as we explore our spirituality and faith and roles as fathers. So, what happens when a pandemic hits with mandatory quarantines and you can't sit in the same room and look each other in the eye and have those meaningful discussion or provide personal support to a father in need?

Well, you do the best you can, and you turn to Zoom—while you lose the personal connection that comes with being in a physical circle with a dozen other men, you can at least still look at each other and have a meaningful discussion. Other than the few weeks immediately after the quarantines were announced and once it became clear, this was going to last for a while, we started meeting virtually and we didn't really miss a beat. We covered a great range of topics including a robust discussion about the fact that Jesus knows us and has called us by name and put us on this earth now for a specific reason. We also had many discussions about the power of prayer and why do so many discussions about challenges always revert back to prayer being a great way to resolve it. We ended our year back in person for the last 4 weeks, wrapping up with a fabulous 45-minute Examen of Conscience while we reflected on the year we had just completed. We also sent a weekly reflection through email that summarized our discussion from the previous Friday and offered an insight into the coming week's topic or about a current event or current reading that prompted a response to something we had discussed or an event happening around us.

I do believe the virtual nature of what we had to do caused us to challenge our inner fortitude to keep going. This year was the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of this ministry, and we became much stronger; establishing a core group of men who faithfully attended our Friday zoom calls. What doesn't destroy you makes you stronger, right? I would say Father's Team really proved that this year---the energy and camaraderie we all felt when we were able to get back together was awesome; to the point that we plan to have a standing (or sitting) table at the Echo this summer on Fridays at 7 for anyone who wants to come and have breakfast or coffee or just chat.
