



Holy Gospel

Lk 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table.

"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor.

A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him,

and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say,

'Give your place to this man,'
and then you would proceed with embarrassment
to take the lowest place.
Rather, when you are invited,

go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table.



The Pastor's Corner

Final Mass at St. Margaret-St. John

Between 1920 and 1922, St. Margaret of Cortona was built by parishioners with all of the labor and supplies being donated for free. This was the first church and school building. The current church was built in the 1950's, and the school thrived in that area.

From 1949 to 1952, the St. John Vianney church and school were built on land that had been cleared by the seminarians at that time. Both the church and school flourished.

On September 14, 2008, St. John Vianney Parish and St. Margaret of Cortona Parish officially merged into St. Margaret-St. John Parish, with Masses continuing to be celebrated in both parishes.

This Sunday, August 28, 2022 we will be celebrating our last Mass at St. Margaret-St. John. For many it is a sad day, but it is also a day to look forward to a new journey. With the work of many parishioners, we will still have a presence in Madisonville, which is very important to all of us. As we work through the next few years following the guidance of The Beacons of Light, we will continue to move forward and have daily and weekend Masses in the area.

Please keep all of our parishioners in our family in your prayers as we navigate these new changes. I am blessed to have met so many wonderful and supportive people at St. Margaret-St. John, and I know it was a wonderful experience for our young, newly ordained priests who had the blessing of living on the campus. Amen? Amen.

Purpose:

The Elderly and Homebound Ministry provides a social connection between the parish and those in need. This ministry, through volunteer effort, contacts parish members who reside in residences, nursing facilities, and other home situations. Ministry volunteers offer a listening ear and a comforting presence to those who are ill or homebound. The goal is to offer parishioners an encounter with one another to experience God's goodness and to continue the connection to St. Mary Parish.

What is the scope of the ministry?

Through home visits, reassuring phone calls, and sending cards and bulletins regularly, the parish volunteers will engage the elderly/homebound person through conversation, social, and spiritual support. Word in Your Heart by Stephanie Murphy

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sirach 3:17-18. My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God.

My six-year-old spent the better part of last year responding to compliments by saying either, "I know" or "Thanks! I know." My husband and I tried coaching him on the virtues of humility — yet his "I knows" stubbornly remained.

One day, during a public and high-volume "I know" extravaganza, I pulled my son away from a post-game group of buddies and parents and hissed, "When someone compliments you, why do you continue to say, 'I know'?!"

My little guy gave me the side-eye, "You told me it's important to be truthful. The things they're saying about me ARE true and I am being KIND by agreeing with them. I am fast. I played a good game today. Also — ALL the adults laugh really hard at me and smile after I say, 'I know.' They think I'm funny. I'm making them happy!"

I sighed. "Buddy, remember, try to show some humility. Humility is quiet confidence. It's about feeling good about your hard work and your talents, but also knowing that others are just as good as you are — and not saying 'I know' when you're paid a compliment. Does that make sense?"

"Not really. I know my teammates are really good too —I mean, we're undefeated. It feels like you're asking me to lie and not run as fast or do my best. I don't understand."

"Ok so, you know how God is amazing and really powerful — just like you're pretty fast? Well, despite his power and ability to do great things, he can also be humble. God knows he is special, yet he allowed himself to be crucified. So, he asks us to be humble too. Do you understand?"

"Yes. I'm basically just like God and he might like me more if I walk...maybe even crawl."


