




THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, All make a profound bow:


and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

What is Heaven?

Heaven is the endless moment of love. Nothing more separates us from God, whom our soul loves and has sought our whole life long. Together with all the angels and saints we will be able to rejoice forever in and with God.

If you have ever observed a couple looking at each other lovingly or seen a baby nursing who looks for his mother's eyes as though it wanted to store up every smile forever, then you have some inkling of heaven. To be able to see God face-to-face – that is like one, single, never-ending moment of love. (YOUCAT question 158)



KNOW YOUR SAINTS *Sts. Cosmas and Damian* (died ~ 303)

Nothing is known of their lives except that they suffered martyrdom in Syria during the persecution of the Emperor Diocletian.

A church erected on the site of their burial place was enlarged by the emperor Justinian. Devotion to the two saints spread rapidly in both East and West. A

famous basilica was erected in their honor in Constantinople. Their names were placed in the canon of the Mass (Eucharistic Prayer I), probably in the sixth century.

Legend says that they were twin brothers born in Arabia, who became skilled doctors. They were among those who are venerated in the East as the "moneyless ones" because they did not charge a fee for their services. It was impossible that such prominent persons would escape unnoticed in time of persecution: They were arrested and beheaded.

Nine centuries later, Francis of Assisi (October 4) rebuilt the dilapidated San Damiano chapel outside Assisi.

Second Sunday of Advent

Matthew 3:2. Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!

Advent is penitential, as well as anticipatory — a time to look inward, as well as to look forward.

Today's readings encourage us to "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Why is there a need to repent during this joyful and celebratory time of year? After all, this a great time to host parties, go shopping, attend the Festival of Lights, etc. While the world offers us plenty of distractions — and albeit some are worthy — the scriptures remind us to remain focused on the reason for the season.

With the flurry of activities between Thanksgiving and Christmas, it is easy to take our focus off the Lord. However, if we take Christ out of Christmas, we will end up failing to the make the holidays happy.

John the Baptist tells us to "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." How do we do that? By loving God with our whole heart, mind, body, and soul — as well as loving our neighbor as ourselves. We keep the path straight by living for our Lord.

In the midst of the hustle and bustle of this time of year, the world will tempt us to become distracted by feeding our ego with prestige, popularity, or possessions. Instead, become counter- cultural: repent, turn away or perhaps dial back those temptations. Instead, use this time to deepen your faith. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving need not only apply to Lent.

This Advent, spend more time with the Lord. Refrain from gorging on Christmas delicacies, donate to a special cause, or perform a work of mercy. As John the Baptist also counsels, "Produce good fruit." Advent is to Christmas what Lent is to Easter.
