#### The Feast of Saint Patrick

March 17, 2024

This feast of St. Patrick, I am asking everyone to really model themselves after this truly great saint. Of course it's a tradition to wear green, sing Irish music and enjoy the food and drink of the Irish on this day, but I encourage you to go a step further.

St. Patrick loved God so much that he spent most of his time in prayer so that he could be in the company of The Lord. He realized that prayer could be used when in fear, before a meal, as we wake, and so many other times of the day. We especially should pray when we are feeling spiritual attacked. He was one of the saints that

experienced spiritual warfare and listened to hear God's answers to his prayers. He trusted that answers would come from God and that is something we should do. We should always trust in God, even when our prayers are answered in ways we did not hope for or expect.

His prayers were to be freed from slavery and to return to England. Yet God called Patrick back to Ireland after years of being enslaved. It was not what Patrick prayed and wished for, yet he faithfully went to Ireland. His mission was most successful — he converted the island to Catholicism in his 40 years there. Sometimes that is the way God answers us— by directing us to what He knows is truly good and right for us rather than what we think. We must make His will our own.

May we take this opportunity to live as St. Patrick. Move that step further this year to strengthen our prayer life and love for God. Enjoy the traditions, but challenge yourself to live like this dear saint.




## THE CATECHIST'S CORNER

St. Joseph: The Foster-Father Saint by Maria Riley



About two weeks ago, St. Mary School had the opportunity to host Maria Riley, the author of an up-and-coming Catholic children's series called *Adventures with the Saints*. I was so thankful to be in attendance for her presentation! Maria spoke to the children about how each of them is called to sainthood and that the pathway to fulfilling this calling is intimately related to them becoming who God calls them to be. That is, virtuous men and women who help others to encounter God through the unique gifts and experiences he has given them. Her series, *Adventures with the Saints*, seeks to promote this understanding of our Catholic call to evangelization through shedding light on the stories of the countless holy men and women who we recognize as one with God in Heaven. You might call it a Catholic's reimagining of *The Magic Tree House*, a favorite from my youth, as it combines siblings traveling in time to meet historical figures of influence with lessons about how to live life well. The first book focuses on St. Joseph, whose feast day we celebrate this week, and kicks off the series by focusing on the depth of love between an adoptive parent and child. Main character Joshua, grapples with moving in with a new foster family, the Martins. Through the story of St.


Joseph and the Holy Family, he comes to discover that familial connection goes far beyond blood relations. I encourage you to order this beautiful book and share it with the children in your life!
